### The Little Miami Watershed Speaks: Native Plants for Clean Water

On Saturday, April 5, 2025, the Little Miami Watershed Network will present a native habitat symposium featuring New York Times bestselling author, **Douglas Tallamy**, author of **"Nature's Best Hope"** and several other well-known titles. Mr. Tallamy has been leading the crusade against climate change and the ravishing of our natural environment by encouraging everyone to "go native" and plant native trees, shrubs, and flowers in their own backyards. **Bowyer Farm native plant manager** and Cincinnati Zoo botanist **Brian Jorg** will headline the event sharing his expertise on native Southwest Ohio plants. In addition, the award-winning documentary "WATER" by Gary Beeber will be screened for the first time in Warren County. These presentations will focus on understanding the use of native plant landscapes and best practices in our watershed and all of Ohio's waterways to support clean water at all levels. The symposium will be held at Countryside Y in Lebanon, Ohio which will allow seating for up to 300 ticketed participants.

## The Little Miami Watershed Speaks: Living with Native Plants

**Willow Sponsor:** The graceful willow aka *Salix* is the third most important keystone plant on the planet supporting 327 months and butterflies in southwest Ohio alone. Throughout the Little Miami watershed, the restoration and maintenance of native habitat is paramount to a clean water system. One of the elements of the event that **Willow Tree** sponsor will cover are the fees for the showing of the award-winning and Ohio-produced film **"WATER"**.
